DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: The work involves responsibility for administration of the physical, occupational and speech therapy services provided by Public Health Nursing. Under the general supervision of the Director of Patient Services, the incumbent is involved in developing program policies. Supervision is exercised over assigned staff. Does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:

- 1. Plans, assigns and supervises the work of professional physical, occupational and speech therapy services;
- 2. In consultation with referring physician, designs and implements a therapy program to correct or minimize the patient's disability;
- 3. Provides orientation and training to nurses and support personnel regarding rehabilitation techniques;
- 4. Evaluates the performance of therapists through office conferences, analysis of field reports, individual consultations and field observations;
- 5. Coordinates services with other agencies, hospitals and health care facilities;
- Carries a case load of all types of physical therapy;
- 7. Prepares and assembles educational materials for use in teaching, consultation and advisory services;
- 8. Advises and develops departmental policies for therapy services;
- 9. Attends conferences and meetings as required, acting as department representative;

- 10. Refers patients requiring financial or other assistance to proper agencies or organizations; may initiate or assist in processing requests for equipment or prosthetic devices for patients without financial resources;
- 11. Supervises the selection and maintenance of therapeutic equipment and supplies;
- 12. Evaluates effectiveness of therapy programs;
- 13. Provides advice to patients requiring architectural changes to their homes or the design or adaption of rehabilitation equipment;
- 14. Serves on Utilization Review Committee to provide quality assurance in therapy services.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL

CHARACTERISTICS: Comprehensive knowledge of principles, methods, materials and equipment used in physical therapy; thorough knowledge of the sources of information and current literature and developments in the field of physical therapy; thorough knowledge of anatomy and physiology, as they relate to physical therapy; good knowledge of the proper care and maintenance of apparatus and equipment used; good knowledge of community agencies and public health agencies; ability to plan, organize, and supervise the work of others; ability to provide instruction and demonstrations in physiotherapy techniques; ability to assist in adaption of household layout or therapeutic equipment; ability to establish and maintain good working relationships with staff and clients; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a Bachelor's Degree, including or supplemented by an approved program of instruction in physical therapy and two (2) years of physical therapy experience in a home health agency or public health agency, one (1) year of which must have been in a supervisory capacity.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT: Eligibility for a license issued by the State of New York to practice physical therapy at the time of application and possession of the license with current registration at time of appointment. Possession at time of appointment of a valid driver's license.
